Recently, there have been some concerns with inconsistencies within our academic eligibility policy. Beginning with this most recent eligibility pull, which will go into effect on Monday, December 19, we will be following the BOE policy below without exception until we can review and make any necessary adjustments to the current eligibility policy.

We are in the process of starting an eligibility committee that will work together in reviewing the current policy and providing insight into the potential for change in the policy. That committee will include teachers, administrators, students, and parents and we will be having meetings beginning in early January. If you are interested in being a part of the eligibility committee, please send an email to the director of athletics, Christopher Stuff, Christopher.stuff@clydesavannah.org. If we get an overwhelming response of people that are interested in being a part of the committee, we may have to conduct a lottery to determine who will be a part of the committee.

INELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

PROCEDURES: At the end of the third week of school, and every two weeks thereafter, an eligibility report is generated through School Tool. Teachers will indicate students with failing grades and/or incomplete at that point in the quarter. Failure is considered below a 65% in a class. The consequences for a failing grade(s) are as follows:

One failure - the student will be informed and warned. Parents will be notified in writing.

Two failures - the student is placed on probation for a two-week period. During that period, he/she must bring courses to a passing level. If the student continues to fail two courses after the two-week probationary period, he/she will become ineligible for a two-week period. Ineligibility will continue beyond this time if the student continues to fail two or more subjects. However, if a student on probation is failing only one subject at the end of a probationary period, he/she will revert to warning status. Parents will be notified in writing. A student cannot serve consecutive probation periods, i.e., failing two different courses in consecutive periods. A student failing two different courses in consecutive periods will be considered ineligible until he/she has brought grades for each failed course to a passing level.

Three or more failures - automatic ineligibility for two weeks. The period of ineligibility will continue beyond the two weeks until failing grades are brought up to a passing level. An ineligible student who improves performance such that the student is failing only one subject will be placed under warnings and will become eligible to participate. Parents/Guardians will be notified in writing.

The eligibility period begins on Monday morning following the submission of the grade reports.

Below are the dates that the eligibility report will be pulled, and eligibility will start the Monday following the date:

Eligibility Dates 2023 – 1/5, 1/19, 2/2, 2/23, 3/16, 3/30, 4/20, 5/4, 5/18
