	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Quarter 3 grades will be available May 10.• Students will be afforded the opportunity to raise their grades by submitting back work that will be due no later than Thursday, April 30th.• Marking Period 3 grades, the final grade for the marking period, will be Pass or Fail and will be recorded as such in School Tool.• Pass/Fail will be based on a Pass/Fail rubric.• Report cards—To be mailed the week of 5/11/20• Aside from quarterly report cards, parents and students may get intermittent grading by logging into School Tool and/or emailing teachers.
	Quarter 4 Timelines
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• May 1 through June 17th• MP 4 grades, final grades for Quarter 4 marking period, will be a <i>Pass or Incomplete</i>• Students with an <i>Incomplete as of June 17th</i>, will have the opportunity to make up work until June 26th.• On June 26th, the Incomplete will be changed to a Pass/Fail and will be the final grade for the course for 2019-2020 school year• Report cards—To be mailed the week of 6/29/20• Aside from quarterly report cards, parents and students may get intermittent grading by logging into School Tool and/or emailing teachers.
