Dear Clyde-Savannah CSD Families:

As you know, the world around us is changing rapidly as a result of the novel coronavirus. We have been working diligently with Wayne County Public Health (WCPH), Wayne-Finger Lakes BOCES, New York State Department of Health, and the New York State Education Department to do our part to keep students and staff safe. As of 3:00 p.m. today, Wayne County has declared a State of Emergency.

The Clyde-Savannah Central School District will be closed to students on Monday, March 16, while staff will report in order to prepare materials for our students. School will be in session on Tuesday, March 17 for all students, faculty and staff, as this will allow students to receive their materials and collect other personal belongings. The Clyde-Savannah Central School District will then close from Wednesday, March 18, 2020 through Monday, April 13, 2020. A curriculum plan will be shared with families in the following days.

Families with students in grades Pre-K through 12 are encouraged to sign up for our emergency meal distribution sites. We have set up two distribution sites. The Savannah site will be located at the Savannah Fire Hall, 1770 New York Rt. 89. The Clyde site will be located at the MS/HS building at 215 Glasgow Street. These distribution sites will open on Wednesday, March 18, and will be open Monday to Friday from 10:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. for the remainder of the closure, or until further notice.
